In December 2014, the Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act was signed into law authorizing individuals with disabilities to open tax-exempt savings accounts to save for disability-related expenses without impacting eligibility for resource-based benefits. The Act permits individuals with disabilities to save more than a total of \$2,000 in assets (cash, savings, etc.) in their name in a qualified ENABLE Account. Dear Parishioners,

I'm looking forward to the time that we will be together and I am wondering what God has in store for us? I know this that God is always good, and will bless us in many ways. I have been reading about the building of community in Fr. James Mallon's book, "Divine Renovation". A couple of the keys to this process are prayer, communication and setting expectations. I will go into these ideas in detail as we get to know each other in the days ahead.

As I have been thinking about coming to St. Vincent de Paul, I have considered how it will be new and different from my current assignment at Cathedral of the Risen Christ. One of the most obvious changes is that I will be living by myself. In my 28 years of Priesthood, I have only lived by myself for three years. Those were great years!

I know many are wondering what kind of changes will need to be made with the Mass schedule since I will be the only priest for the parish. As I have been considering this, two things have come to mind. First is the history of the current Mass schedule, and the other is the importance of building community. Fr. Barak told me that the 8 pm Mass on Sunday evening began as a Wednesday evening Mass for the College students. For years the weekend Mass schedule with a Saturday night Vigil and an 8 and 10 am Sunday morning Mass met the needs of the Parish. More Masses makes it convenient to attend Mass, but it divides the community. There are many plans and hopes that you have put together in your strategic planning and it is important that we come together in prayer and form a stronger community so that together we can accomplish God's will for St. Vincent de Paul parish.

Gathering all of these thoughts and reasons together, I have decided that the Mass schedule will be 5:30 pm Saturday evening, and 8 and 10 am Sunday morning effective immediately. I do intend to work with the Catholic Education and Youth Engagement and Spirituality committee's once I arrive to look at ways to meet the spiritual needs of all in the Seward community. The Lord always provides us opportunities to grow spiritually and He asks us to participate it this work, and I look forward to working with you in this capacity.
