## A LETTER FROM MONSIGNOR

Dear Parishioners,

On Thursday, I attended the first evening of the “Healing the Whole Person” conference. I knew the basics of the conference and I knew that it would be filled with charismatic prayer. I was a little surprised by a skit that was performed depicting the Blessed Trinity and the fall of Adam and Eve. The presenters said that we have statues that we look at and they can help us in prayer. As we look at an image of Mary holding Jesus, or the famous statue of Mary holding crucified Jesus, we can pray and reflect on their love for us. They said that if we can look at a lifeless statue to help us pray, then we can look at live people modeling the Trinity and Adam and Eve to help us pray.

So, three people stood together representing the Trinity, then Adam and Eve (a married couple) were called to be in the center of the Trinity. Then the fall was represented by Adam and Eve separating from the Trinity and from each other, standing on either side of the Trinity. Then Jesus stood with his arms out, representing the crucifixion, with his arms held up by the Father and the Spirit, called Adam and Eve back into communion with Him and with each other. Each of these poses by the actors was held for what seemed like an eternity, helped everyone there to pray about relationship with God as Trinity and with one another, and what sin and brokenness does to our relationship with the Trinity and one another. I believe that everyone walked away from that evening cognizant of their personal brokenness and the brokenness that is in the world. I believe that everyone walked away with that awareness, but also with the understanding and experience that Jesus heals and is the answer the brokenness in the world.

As I was driving home I continued to think about it, and I thought about the importance of having the image of crucified Jesus in our sanctuary. I know that some say that they don’t want to see the brokenness of Jesus and that they want to only see the resurrected Jesus. The reality is, that brokenness is all around us, and the understanding that Jesus shares our brokenness is a great comfort to us. The resurrection is the end result of the healing that comes from the cross. The passion and death of Jesus is the primary focus of the Mass, and our communion is the healing gift that comes from the cross.

I have been asked to teach about the reason I think that a crucifix should be in the sanctuary, and my experience Thursday evening seems like a good way to express this thought. God Bless you. -Msgr. Tucker
