## Silver Rose Mass

The Running of the Silver Rose across Nebraska began on August 20th with its first stop in Scottsbluff. We will take the handoff from the Fr. John B. Wallace council in Gretna on Saturday the 21st. Key Meyer will be delivering the rose to the church Saturday morning and we will celebrate Mass that evening. That Monday the 23rd the Silver Rose will be handed off to the St. Peter council in Lincoln.

In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson expanded the program by beginning the “Running of the Rose” from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Toronto. “The ‘Running of the Rose’ is a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus,” said Supreme Knight Anderson. “Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order’s dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of ‘One Life, One Rose,’ it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses.” The Silver Rose program features a sculpted silver rose carried by Knights from Canada through the United States to Mexico, bringing the Culture of Life message on its journey. The Silver Rose is received at councils and parishes along its journey, and masses and prayer services are offered. Special border ceremonies with Fourth Degree honor guards are held when the rose is transferred from one state to another, as well as internationally.
