A LETTER FROM MONSIGOR

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you to all who attended the strategic planning meeting on Tuesday. We went through the goals and objectives that we set down in 2017 and it was good to see that many of those have either been met, or are actively going on today. The biggest thing that we see, and it has been a struggle over the last 10 years is the efforts to increase our enrollment. The people present at the meeting on Tuesday had so many good things to say about the school, and many parents that had children in our school in the early days said how important it is to have a Catholic school.

There were problems last year and as a result our enrollment went down this year. I'm not going into great detail about the problems, as I have said before that there were academic problems, and administrative issues that lead parents to make the decision to seek another route for their children's education. Both of these issues are currently being addressed, and changes have been made over the summer, and are continually being made to make St. Vincent's a better school.

When we took a closer look at the academic scores of our students on the lowa Basic assessment, our students were above the national average and have been above the national average for many years. Some of our scores were slightly above the national average, and that is not the usual case for a Catholic school. Usually the scores in a Catholic school are much higher than the National average. This is one of the major areas that we are working on, and during the summer there was a lot of work done on our Math curriculum to make sure that we are aligned with State standards and looking at ways to increase Math computation and comprehension. We realize that this is an effort that needs to take place in all of our academic disciplines, and it is an effort that we are truly committed to. Yet the greatest gift that our Catholic school offers to our students is the gift of a deeper life with Jesus. The daily celebration of Mass and the religion classes and other religious celebrations that we have during the year help our students grow in their life with Jesus.

I was good to hear from our families about the importance of our Catholic School, and we will continue working on our Strategic planning. Our next meeting with be January 7th, and we will be focusing on ways to increase our enrollment, and we will be talking about our current building and how we should expand our facility when the time is right. We are taking a sure and steady approach to this planning, but we need a clear plan for the future and we need your participation in this planning. Please put this date down on your calendar now, and there will be more information about it as we get closer to the date. God Bless you.
