A LETTER FROM MSGR. TUCKER

Dear Parishioners,

This week there are two things on my mind. One is our upcoming Stewardship renewal, and the second is the National Eucharistic Revival. The revival began in June, on the Feast of Corpus Christi. There have been articles in the Southern Nebraska Register’s last two issues. This Sunday evening I will be speaking specifically about the revival at a Pub Theology event at the Bottle Rocket. I plan to make it informative, but also to generate discussion about things we can do as a Parish or as Individuals to create engagement into this National Catholic effort.

Our Stewardship is an acknowledgement of our identity as children of God, blessed by our Creator with who we are and everything we possess. A Stewardship Way of Life, professes this truth and responds in love and gratitude, to our gracious Creator. Please begin to think and pray about your individual response to God. He is constantly giving us invitations to dive deeper into His life, and your prayer will reveal to you this invitation. Ask in your prayer, “What can I do for you? You who have given me everything out of love for me. I want to love and serve you God, teach me and lead me to a grateful way of giving on myself, in love of you”. I assure you if, you ask, God will reveal it to you.

To put one thought of service in your mind, I will tell you about a conversation I had with a parishioner. I know this insight shared with me is true, because I have witnessed it myself. It was communicated to me that there are many Catholics in Nursing Homes in Seward and Milford, that do not get many visitors. Their families either live a long distance from here, or they do not have any relatives that can visit. They are lonely and they have so much to give. They are faithful Catholics that have a deep love for God, and they can share so much with others. They need someone to stop by and receive their gift. The idea is, if members of St. Vincent’s would visit them, and announce they are from the Parish, it will be like God coming to visit them. It will also be the reception of God’s love for the visitor, because these people truly have a great love for God. Think about forming a group of visitors to the Nursing Homes.

The First year of the Eucharistic revival is really a planning phase, and the second year will be more of instructional year. The final year will be focused on preparing for a Eucharistic Congress to be held in Indianapolis in the middle of July. The Eucharistic Congress will draw people for all corners of the US, and then a missionary command will be given to bring Jesus to all people. We are the only Church that proclaims that bread and wine truly become the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus, and call these elements the Real Presence of Jesus. I know our profession of faith is correct, but there are many who doubt this belief, or do not understand the radical nature of this proclamation. There are many things that have happened over the last few years that have decreased Church attendance, and the cultural climate is yearning for answers, so now is the time for a renewal, a revival, to set hearts on fire for Jesus again. Please pray about these two intentions, and join together to build up the Church. God Bless you.

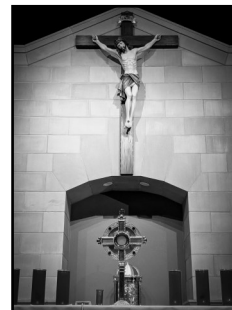


PCCW Pies
