A LETTER FROM MSGR. TUCKER

Dear Parishioners,

I am sure that you are feeling the busyness of the fall with numerous activities going on. There is something good about this busyness, as it can help us identify our purpose. The Church has been filled with children since the middle of August. This is the purpose given to us by Jesus, to baptize and teach, and as the Gospel of Mark accounts; Jesus desires for the children to come to Him.

During my pilgrimage to the Holy Land we began in Jordan going to Mnt. Nebo and to Petra. These are the places of Aaron's death, and a view over the Jordan river and the Promised Land which Moses was able to see before his death. While in Jordan we visited a shop that makes mosaics. The mosaic in the Narthex which displays Jesus embracing the children was made in that shop. I brought it back to remind us of the purpose of Church and desire that Jesus has for us. We are sons and daughters of God, and Jesus used the title "Son of Man" or "Son of God" for Himself. This makes Jesus our brother, and it also makes us sons and daughters of God. As children of God, the Father has a great love for us, and He desires to embrace us, and to be present in our lives. The image in the mosaic expresses Jesus delight when his family is near Him. The image should inspire us to come the Church to be with Jesus, and it should also give us inspiration to invite others to come with us.

During this first year of the Eucharistic Revival we are to reflect on the reason that we come to Church. The reason has to be the encounter with Jesus, which is an experience of His love and delight in us, that we know through receiving Him in the sacrament of His body and blood. This year is a time to reflect on Jesus presence in the Eucharist and to renew our love for Him in that sacrament, but also to reflect on His effect in our lives through faithful reception of Him. Our personal experience and sharing that with others will help those who have been away from the Church for a long time to return. The Church is a community that cares for one another, and we should never write anyone off.

I was talking with a priest friend of mine the other day, and he recounted a story of a young man, who had been away from the Church for a long time. During the course of that journey away from the Church, Jesus touched his hardened heart, and welcomed Him home. Jesus set a fire in this young man's heart, and he accepted the invitation to serve Jesus. The young man began to pursue the vocation to the priesthood, but ultimately he pursued the purpose that God created him for. This is where we find our joy, and the desire that Jesus has for each of us, that in following the purpose He has for us, that we will find the joy that He desires to be ours. God Bless you. Msgr. 
