# **LETTER FROM MSGR. TUCKER**

### Dear Parishioners.

We received the relic of Blessed Stanley Rother this week for our altar. I have been reading the book Bishop Conley gave us about Fr. Rother. His story is interesting and ordinary at the same time. His family were immigrants from Germany and settled in Minnesota. During the homestead days, land was given away in Oklahoma, and a grandfather decided to take his family even though his relatives said that they would never make it. They endured the dirty 30's and survived on their farm with their own garden, chickens and cows that allowed them to get some money to purchase other things that they needed.

Fr. Stanley grew up on that farmstead, and he and his brothers and sister, worked together to make things work on the farm. They were strong boys and were not afraid of work. They were a faithful family and parish life was central to their life. The kids went to the Catholic School, priests were always at their home, visiting and working on the farm. One priest worked for Franz Rother to earn money to afford a vacation. The priests were missionaries, as Oklahoma was a missionary Diocese, but they also served in foreign mission work before coming to Okarche, Oklahoma. In their church was a stained-glass window with an image of St. Francis Xavier, who was a missionary to India. The sisters, the Adorers of the Blood of Christ, were present in their school and parish and had a huge influence on the families faith. From the Rother family, both Stanley, and his sister Elizabeth left home to answer the call to religious life the same year.

Reading this story, it sounds like our families in the Midwest. It is a reminder to us that in the ordinary events of daily life, we are support by God, and called to serve Him. I am so glad that we have this relic for the altar, and as I continue to read about Blessed Stanley, I will share more information about him. This is the way we develop a devotion to a saint of God. Since he has not been canonized by the Church yet, the Church must still be waiting on miracles through his intercession. We can ask for his intercession for things that are clearly impossible, knowing that God can do all things. Trusting in God's power might and mercy, we bring our petitions to Him through our saintly friends. I encourage you to bring those impossible situations to God through Blessed Stanley. Blessed Stanley Rother, pray for us! -Msgr. Tucker
