MESSAGE FROM MSGR. TUCKER

Dear Parishioners,

Early voting is beginning as absentee ballots are being mailed out. Remember that a vote needs to be cast on both initiatives #434 and #439. As Catholics we vote for the Pro-life initiative 434, and we vote no for the Pro-abortion initiative 439. The bulletin insert shows the difference between the two, and clearly points out how 439 opens the door to erase all pro-life efforts and bills that are in place through 50 years of legislative work.

I am grateful for all the work that went into planning the Corn-Holy tournament this year, and the gift it has been to us over the years. The idea was great, and it brings a lot of people together for a fun day, and it provides funds for our school.

During this month of October, we encourage everyone to pray the rosary. October 7th is the feast of the Holy Rosary, and it is also the anniversary of the beginning of the war in Israel, which is continuing and spreading into Lebanon and causing unrest in all of the Middle East. One intention when you pray the rosary is for peace. There are many other intentions we should be praying for too. We should be praying for respect for life, for our seminarians and for priests, for our government officials and their concern for the common good of all persons, for our presidential election in November, for our local farmers and their safety during harvest, and the list can go on. The important thing to remember is that God can do all things, and Mary is our most important intercessor, so we entrust our concerns to her prayerful help as she presents our needs to her beloved son, Jesus.

Remember that Wednesday evening we have our first Encounter night, and we have a great speaker on for that evening. The evening will begin at 7 pm, and it will include an inspirational talk from Danny Ledger and songs of praise and worship. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed during this Encounter evening, and confessions will be heard also.
