#### **MESSAGE FROM MSGR. TUCKER**

Dear Parishioners,

Msgr. Tucker

This week we have a holy day of obligation. On Friday we will celebrate All Saints day, and that feast is a one of obligation. Please look at the Mass times and plan on attending one of the Masses.

Our general election is November 5th, and it is important to be good citizens by voting. Everyone hears people complain about our culture or society, and yet we have many that choose not to vote. You can still vote early by going to the courthouse and picking up your ballot, taking time to review it and study the candidates and make an informed choice and return your ballot to the courthouse.

I started reading again, Peter Hegseth's book, Battle for the American Mind. In the first chapter he makes a statement that I think is good to ponder. He states that if we want to consider where our political parties will be in the next decade, look at our current culture. Then he went to his church one weekend, and the pastor said, if you want to consider where our culture will be in the next decade, look at our current religious practice. There is nothing more fundamental to our decision making and our formation of culture than our practice of religion. When I use the phrase "practice of religion" I have in mind the inner transformation that relationship with God makes in the hearts of believers. Anyone can go to church, or have devotions, and their heart and mind are not engaged. The one who engages mind and heart in relationship with God will be transformed. This transformation will change the way we think and act, and it changes culture. We can easily complain about culture and politics, but the only way these things will change is in true relationship with God. God Bless all of us!
