### MESSAGE FROM MSGR. TUCKER

Dear Parishioners,

Saturday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> was the Feast of All Souls Day, and the whole month of November is a time we remember our beloved deceased relatives and friends. There is a plenary indulgence that we can attain for a deceased person by visiting the cemetery and praying for the souls of the deceased. We can simply pray, "Eternal Rest to them of God, and let perpetual light shine upon them". Or we can pray in any fashion we are called to pray for the deceased. The indulgences are acts of piety that the church has defined as a way for us to received forgiveness for the punishment associated with sin. God forgives sin, yet there is a need for personal reparation for our sins. Responding to God's grace, doing the good that He calls us to is a form of reparation for sins. We can do these pious deeds and offer them for ourselves or for others. This is the basic understanding of indulgences, and the practice is clearly found in the scriptures, as it speaks of the need to make up for what is lacking in the suffering of Christ. His sacrifice is sufficient for the forgiveness of all sin, and what is lacking is our response to His grace in offering reparation for our sins. God grants us time in this life to do so, and if that does not happen during the years we are here on earth, He mercifully grants that purification in the next life (which is also scriptural) in purgatory. During this month, let us remember our beloved deceased friends.

In our Parish Council meeting it was brought to my attention that people are asking about the sprinklers that have been installed. A generous donation was received for the sprinklers, and the reason for the installation is to provide better curb appeal. I remember when I was in another parish looking at the sidewalk seeing weeds growing in all of the cracks. The same was true in the driveway, and the parking lot. It looked like no one cared for the property. You can see the same thing as the grass becomes unmanageable, or if there is clutter in the yard. You may say we should not worry about what others think, but I think there is a message that is sent when the grass is green, and things are orderly, that great care is being taken of the property. This is the house of God, so great care should be taken of the grounds. That is happening as our building is in great shape, and our basement is getting organized. It has been a long time since the sprinkler system went out, and since it could not be repaired, a new system was installed, which again is a sign that people care about the house of God. I appreciate the gift, and I look forward to a green lawn next year. God Bless.


