

MESSAGE FROM MSGR TUCKER:

Dear Parishioners,

I mentioned last weekend that by Sunday we will most likely have a new Pope. On Thursday, the Cardinals elected Cardinal Robert Prevost to be our next Pope, and he selected the name Leo, and is now Pope Leo XIV. He is the first American and the first Augustinian priest to assume the role of pope.

There is a lot on social media about Pope Leo, and I believe there are a few things that are important to reflect on. First is that no one was talking about Cardinal Prevost as a possible successor of St. Peter. This reminds us that no one can out guess the Holy Spirit! No one expected an American pope, and as one of my priest friends said, "this may have brought an end to the strangle hold the Italians have had on the papacy". I think that it does say something about the view of the Cardinals on the Church in the world today.

Pope Leo comes from poor roots, served the poor in Peru and has the spirituality of St. Augustine. All of these are part of what the Cardinals recognize as needs in our world today. There is a great article in the New York Times that outlines his family background on his maternal side. His grandparents on his maternal side were in New Orleans. They are Creole, with his grandfather's birthplace listed as the Dominican Republic and his grandmother from New Orleans. Pope Leo's service in Peru, his missionary spirit, and the selection of the name Leo, along with his opening statement, indicate that he will continue the mission of the church to reach out to those who are disadvantaged and view themselves as marginalized. He is a very intelligent man, having studied mathematics at Villanova and receiving a doctorate in Canon Law in Rome. The selection of a Pope from a religious order has not happened often in the history of the church, but it brings with it a spirituality that can be shared with the world. One of the most famous pope's that came from a religious order was Pope St. Gregory who bears the title "great".

We have a special connection with Pope Leo XIV as an American, let us also have a spiritual connection with him by keeping him in our daily prayers. We will soon see where the Holy Spirit is guiding the church, and we need to pray for the grace to follow the lead of our Holy Father. God Bless you.
